It goes without saying that this experience has had its ups and downs, but anything worth doing usually does.

Being a worship leader has taught me many lessons about myself and has helped to define who I am. There are many challenges that I have faced during my time as a worship leader; many of which have sculpted

parts of my character. One challenge that stands out for me is the battle between great music and great worship. One would likely assume that these two things would easily live in harmony, but it can in fact create immense conflict. There is a certain amount of sensitivity that must be adhered to when leading worship. As a worship leader, we must keep the congregation's needs a priority over any personal wants or needs.

A good example would be in the instance where I would want to use a particular song in worship, but I know that this song will not promote the congregation to fall into worship. With Christian music sounding more and more like secular music nowadays, it is more important than ever to give more attention and consideration to the songs we select. Another example is relating to the musicality of praise. Praise is a great tool that can be used to not only give worship to God, but to also prepare the hearts of the congregation for the sermon that follows. If the musicality of the praise is poor, however, it can become a distraction from the worship itself. On the other hand, if the accompaniment of the praise becomes the focus of the worship team, it is very easy to lose the essence of worship as well. I remember when I was in high school, during a time when our worship team was just starting to sound better musically, I used to feel guilty because I felt like any focus on the music was taking away from our focus on God. It was not until a few years later that I realized that good musicality is also important in worship, because like all other things, we should always try to give our BEST to God. Using this mentality, I now lead worship with the notion of giving my BEST worship first, accompanied by my BEST musical ability.

After all these years of leading worship, many people ask me how I could do anything for such a long time. As much of a commitment as it is, it is extremely rewarding as well. The relatiwonships I have built within our team are friendships that I know I will cherish forever. We have grown together and have built strong unique relationships with each other. I only have happy ambitions for the future of our team. Here's to the next 15 years!

Today, I am realizing that He required my understanding of hunger and fear of poverty which brings vulnerability and even anger at times, all for His ministry. Only with this understanding, can I be useful in His ministry that opens up my deeper compassionate heart to truly "serve".

Too often I am faced with my apathy for others, quick temper, and desire to control and exercise power. However, despite all of this, I believe I was sent to do what I can possibly do at each moment. To give out what was provided as fairly as possible. To listen carefully, to be stern with decisions made and yet to break the rules when needed and most of all, to serve with a smile! Teesdale Place has been a place to practice Love. It has enlarged and stretched my heart allowing it to continually grow with compassion and to understand the meaning of the command "Love your God and love your neighbour".

Teesdale Food Bank Ministry is coordinated with Daily Bread Food Bank, our KSM and ESM members, and the local volunteers. To this day, I serve with the vision Rev In Kee Kim shared when we started; we are there to help and empower the local volunteers so that they can become the leaders of their community. I am beginning to see that vision coming true!!!

JULY 7 "Beyond Expectations" 2 Kings 5:1-14

What is important is not to make and shape our life according to our expectations but to know and sense the movement of God in our lives and follow it. God does not lead our life as we expect. Sometimes God leads us into a place where we don't want to go. Sometimes, God leads us in totally unexpected ways.

"There Is Need of Only One Thing" Luke 10:38-42

The reason why we cannot hear God's voice is because our hearts are scattered. We worry about a lot of things. We want to have too many things. Jesus said to Martha: "...you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing." We have become so shallow that the words of Jesus cannot take root in us. JULY 14 "Who Do You Say Your Neighbor Is?" Luke 10:25-37
